



Profile – Pastor Darryl L. Jones

Pastor Jones received Christ on June 17, 1979 through the ministry of Pastor C.S. Surry (Pleasant Hill Missionary Baptist Church Atlanta Georgia). He was an active member with the young adult choir and the male chorus. In August of 1988, God would lead him to Mount Nebo Baptist Church and Life Center Atlanta Georgia. Under the leadership of Pastor A.J. McMichael several opportunities for spiritual growth were afforded. As a member of the choir Pastor Jones would be elected to lead the choir as

its president. He would also serve as a Bible study teacher. In September of 1991 Pastor Jones received his call from God into the preaching ministry. He would serve as a staff minister where in addition to preaching duties he would direct the new members class, teach Introduction to the Bible and Bible 101. Pastor Jones received his ordination in January 1997. His preaching and teaching has led him throughout the southeast region of the United States of America.

In September 1999 He would meet Pastor R. L. Mallory of Macedonia AME Church. Pastor Mallory offered a tremendous opportunity for ministry. As time would proceed Pastor Mallory encouraged Pastor Jones to utilize his ministerial services at Macedonia. Pastor Jones accepted the opportunity to serve. He would receive his license to preach in the AME church from the presiding elder Reverend Doctor Earle H. Ifill of the Atlanta East District of the Atlanta North Georgia Conference. Pastor Jones was admitted into the class on admissions in the Atlanta North Georgia Conference under the leadership of Bishop Frank C. Cummings. Pastor Jones was ordained an itinerant deacon in 2003 by Bishop Frank C. Cummings. He would also receive his ordination as an itinerant elder in 2005 by Bishop William P. DeVeaux. Pastor Jones would supply at Cargle Chapel AME in Social Circle, Georgia and Moses Chapel AME Church in Rutledge Georgia.

Pastor Jones received his education from the Atlanta Public School System. He graduated from George Washington Carver High School. He furthered his education at Morris Brown College and graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration. He would then go on and obtain a Master of Divinity Degree in Pastoral Care and Psychology of Religion from the Interdenominational Theological Center. Pastor Jones is currently pursuing a Doctorate of Ministry at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Virginia.

Pastor Jones is currently employed with the Georgia Department of Revenue as a Revenue Agent. His career experience also includes ten years of banking experience in the bankcard division of Wachovia Bank. He also spent approximately seven years teaching physical education and health in both public and private schools in metro Atlanta schools. Furthermore he has over five years of retail management experience with the Quiktrip Corporation.

Presently, Pastor Jones is leading Moses Chapel AME Church into the future. He began by improving the financial structure of the church by computerizing its budget. The Church debuted it's website in 2006 that features the church vision and mission at www.moseschapelame.org. Pastor Jones started with no members or roll of members. The church completed his first year with six new members and an average attendance of twelve worshippers. Presently membership has increased by 50% .He moved the worship service from two Sundays a month to every Sunday. The members of Moses Chapel voted to move worship services to Atlanta. Pastor Jones and members of “The MC” work tirelessly evangelizing in their new community.

Pastor Jones is a dedicated servant of the Lord who loves the Lord with all his heart, mind and soul and loves his neighbor as himself.
